and we all want to ensure their well-being and safety.

Although the Greenacres Woodward Community Radio Patrol is out daily throughout the year to provide watchful eyes to protect our neighborhood from crime, it increases its patrolling during the days surrounding Halloween. We encourage everyone to help keep our children safe.

Moment of Silence and Request for Support

At the GWCA Concert and Picnic in the Park held on 9/11, residents Frank and Karen Hammer led the gathering in a moment of silence for the family members who lost loved ones on 9/11/2001. They also announced that some of the family members which formed "9/11 Fam-

ilies for Peaceful Tomorrows" were appealing to President Biden on behalf of the people of Afghanistan, now that the US military had pulled out. In the wake of 20 years of war, millions of Afghans are now facing famine.

The 9/11 families are concerned that President Biden is withholding several billion dollars which they say rightfully belongs to the Afghan people. They object to paying settlements to the 9/11 families out of that \$7 billion. In their words: "President Biden: We all lost loved ones on September 11th and call upon you to return the Afghan Central Bank funds to the Afghan people. This is their money, not ours."

"Affirming that these funds belong to the Afghan people will not solve Afghanistan's problems; figuring out how to transfer the money directly to the Afghan people is a formidable task. But the point is: this money is theirs, not ours. Simply put, this money belongs to the Afghan people, not 9/11 family members – and they need it more."

The Hammers set up a petition for Greenacres residents and others to sign if you would like to show your support. You can find the petition at change.org. Look for "9/11 families Afghans." Thank you.

For Net Zero Emissions, We Need Net Zero Poverty

Study reveals what's needed for our future Summarized by Karen Hammer*

"Inequality and poverty play a huge role in enabling us to move forward," [to address climate catastrophe] said Sandrine Dixson-Decleve,** one of a panel of scientists who updated the 1972 computer simulation, "Limits to Growth." They used an "Average Wellbeing Index," to answer: How can we increase the wellbeing of humanity during the rest of this century, using data from the 1980-2020 period? The Index tracked 1) disposable income, 2) income inequality, 3) government services, 4) the climate crisis, 5) perceived progress, and 6) relationship to measures of social trust.

"As social trust goes down, it limits the speed of public policy action," study co-author Per Espen Stoknes told Reuters, "...[it determines] how much regulation and subsidies become a part of greening both the economy and the energy system."

How would differing policies impact the world? The study provided two scenarios:

- "Too Little Too Late:" no change in human behavior: so, the wellbeing of the average worker, those who spend most of what they earn in a year peaks around the year 2000.
- "The Giant Leap:"- stabilize global temperatures below 2°C above the industrial era and eradicate poverty by 2050-- transform the world's economic and social systems, phase out fossil fuel use, ensure adequate pensions, tax the richest 10% more, and cancel all low-income countries' debt.

Conclusion: left unchecked, rising inequality leaves people less trusting of governments and other institutions. It makes needed co-operation to deal with climate change, and other threats, more difficult. Tackling inequality is key to securing the public support that's essential to overhaul the global economy and reverse climate change and carnage. Their book Earth For All, ***gives details, and is "an antidote for despair and a roadmap to a better future."

Vacated Alleys: Our Responsibility

What is a vacated alley? A vacated alley is one where the City has given up all rights to use it as an alley for traffic and/or garbage pickup. Utilities may have legal use of the space for underground lines and aerial cables.

Once the alley has been vacated by the City, ownership of the land goes to the adjacent property owners. Half of the alley goes to the property owners on opposite sides of the alley. So,



each property owner will gain about a ten foot wide strip across the back of the owner's property.

Each owner becomes responsible for keeping that strip in good order by complying with City Codes: by keeping the property free of weeds, trash and other debris. The property owner can also fence in that strip and make it a usable part of the lot.




